



WHAT IS THE WABASH VALLEY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION, INC.?

The Wabash Valley Community Foundation, Inc. and its affiliate, the Clay County Community Foundation, gives money to various charitable organizations to provide specific charitable works throughout the Wabash Valley. These gifts of money for a specific purpose are called “grants.” The Community Foundation provides funding for education, arts and cultural activities, community development, social service and religion.

The Community Foundation, has a Youth Grant Committee to review and recommend youth-directed grants throughout Clay County. A limited number of youth will be selected to serve on the Community Foundation’s Youth Grant Committee. The Youth Grant Committee has a specific amount to grant for each academic year to award in grants to youth-serving organizations throughout Clay County. This committee will be responsible for recruiting, reviewing and recommending grant proposals for funding.

ATTENDANCE, COMMITMENT AND PARTICIPATION

The Youth Grant Committee meets 1 time per month during the school year, and occasionally at other times as needed for trainings, etc. If selected, members are expected to attend all meetings and training workshops.

WHAT WILL I GET OUT OF THIS?

You will learn to work together to recommend, encourage and evaluate projects that will benefit your community. You will learn to identify community needs and about evaluating projects that will make a difference in our community. What you learn will help you strengthen your leadership skills.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF ME?

- Commit to attend and participate in all meetings.
- Understand that you will need to spread the word about the availability of these grant funds throughout the community.
- Understand that you represent your school, organization and community as a LEADER.
- Have parent’s or guardian’s permission to participate
- Be responsible for class work missed because of work with the Youth Grant Committee.
- Are enrolled in grade 9, 10 or 11 during the current academic year.
